

Conrad Crowl of Baltimore, MD

Some printed material has stated that Conrad Crowl of Baltimore, MD was the Conrad Grauel who arrived in America on the ship Elizabeth in 1733 with his father, Johan Michael Grauel, his mother, Elizabeth and sister Anna Catherine. However these two children actually died at sea according to the ships list at Philadelphia. Johan Michael Grauel/ Crowl had another son named Conrad born 11 Jan 1756 at Berks Co., PA bpt. 24 Jan 1756 at Hain's church. Conrad is named in Johan Michael's will at York Co., PA. Conrad appears on the 1800 Census of Washington Co., MD purchases land there and sells it in 1813 when he moves to Greene Co., OH

The Conrad Crowl of Baltimore is first mentioned on 14 Dec 1773 in "Straatsbote" a German newspaper printed from 1767-1779 The paper printed a query stated "Johann Andreas Krauel, location - Golden Swan Inn, Third St, Philadelphia. Born in Grossen Bernden, Brandenburg, seeks his brother Johann Conrad Krauel who came to America from London four years ago."

In the same paper dated 7 Jun 1774 - "Conrad Krauel, location near Lebanon, PAA Occupation, Miller seeks his brother Andrea who came to America last Autumn"

From the 1777 Tax List of Londonderry, Lancaster Co., PA shows Conrad Crawl - this was the part of Lancaster Co. that would become Lebanon Co. in 1813.

Family history states that Andrew (Andrea/Andreas) went to Virginia and was never heard from again. Indeed research in Virginia has not turned up a man by that name.

Conrad may have born about 1750. He married Mary Salter probably at Lebanon Co., PA
Conrad died 1804 at Baltimore, MD. Conrad had children baptized 21 Oct 1795 at Baltimore: Abraham, David, Isaac and Jacob.

We can not find Conrad on the 1790 or 1800 Census of Pennsylvania or Maryland. The first appearance of this family on a Census is Abraham in Baltimore in 1820.

2. Henry Crowl according to family information was born 23 Feb 1776 at Jonestown, PA d. Jan 1866 at Baltimore, Md. He married 26 Sep. 1810 at the First Methodist Episcopal Church to Mary Hiss. She is Mary Gatch Hiss d/o Jacob Hiss. However, I believe that Henry had earlier married 1 Oct 1801 to Mary Lewis at Zion Lutheran Church of Baltimore. A Mary Crowle age 44 (b. 1806) is living with the family on the 1850 Census of Baltimore. Family information says the family consisted of the following:
